Abdomen for Physicians Module Lead

(Medical Applications of Point-of-Care Ultrasound of the Abdomen)

Overview:

Target Audience:

Acute and general physicians, emergency clinicians, GPs, and intensivists who want to use ultrasound more confidently in the assessment of undifferentiated abdominal complaints.

What You'll Teach:

- Indications for abdominal PoCUS and how it integrates with other imaging modalities
- Image acquisition and optimisation techniques, including artefact recognition
- Normal and abnormal ultrasound appearances of key abdominal structures in acute medical contexts
- Interpretation of PoCUS findings in clinical scenarios such as:
 - o Renal impairment
 - o Anuria
 - o Loin pain
 - Abdominal swelling
 - Hypotension
 - Suspected acute aortic syndromes
- How PoCUS findings influence further investigations and shape clinical management

Teaching Format:

 Online pre-learning followed by hands-on scanning, available across six or seven scheduled training days

- Candidates are not required to attend every session they can select the dates that suit them
- Small-group scanning using models and simulators, with focused case discussions
- Emphasis on practical skill development and applying ultrasound findings to medical decision-making
- Each candidate delivers a short case presentation as part of the module
