

## **Video Directing Doctor**

We are looking for a part-time Video Directing Doctor, four-five days per month, to work in a small team on the creation of videos for our medical training company.

This role will involve working with a Video Director, who will provide creative guidance, an experienced video editor, a marketing manager and one or two actors.

A range of different short videos are required, some for marketing purposes and some for training purposes. We also aim to create small numbers of comedy videos for our YouTube channel.

The filming will take place at our premises near London Bridge station. The company has its own equipment.

Our company provides training courses and training resources for qualified doctors who are advancing their careers as specialists, particularly in emergency medicine and related areas.

The key responsibilities are:

- Agree project priorities with the company director and senior staff
- Work with team members and subject specialists in developing ideas and designing engaging, accurate and where possible, entertaining videos.
- Work with the team in planning efficient and effective filming sessions
- Use initiative in identifying existing videos which could be improved
- Be prepared to work within agreed cost limits and to be cost efficient, creating good volumes of high quality work.
- Help to identify junior doctors willing to act as doctors in training videos

It should clearly explain your clinical experience, particularly in emergency medicine and it should clearly explain your experience in planning filming, acting, camera work and video editing.
